West Euston Time Bank - Introduction

Our mission is to bring people together in neighbourly co-operation through the exchange of time, skills and knowledge, the provision of activities to build skills, trust and a sense of well-being for individuals, families and the wider community.

A Time Bank is a way for people to share skills with others in their local community and be rewarded for it - in time. For every hour you give providing a service for another participant you receive one credit.

The Time Bank runs a wide range of regular workshops including Learning & Conversational English, Jeweller Making, Bollywood Music & Singing, Line and Street Dancing and afterschool clubs on Wednesdays and Fridays.

It also runs a popular Parent & Toddler drop-in, a community café and a pensioners luncheon club. The Time Bank organises a Family Activities Programme during the school holidays and numerous cultural and community events throughout the year.

It has a current membership of 231 adults and nearly 400 children 75% of whom live on the Regents Park Estate with an incredibly diverse range of home languages (27 at the last count), different cultures and ethnic backgrounds.

The Time Bank runs a programme of workshops for local families and children in July and August each year. The most recent programme in the Summer 2011 involved 116 families with 224 children under 11 years of age.

Although the Time Bank concentrates mostly on local children under 11 years of age it does welcome local teenagers especially those with younger siblings already involved who can provide positive encouragement with the aim of bringing different age groups together in harmony and positivity.

The Just Us! Project

We employed two experienced teachers, Mia Nicastro and Marian Hassan (who is our P/T development worker and who also works as a dance teacher). Both worked as a project team with 63 children from 7 - 12 years of age and 7 older teenagers in script writing and developing a series of dance pieces, production and editing of a sound track. These activities took place afterschool during the week and in the school holidays with a public performance(s) put on in late October 2011.

There were several local teenagers who expressed a great interest in learning street dance and sound editing and these were involved in the project.

An essential element were the crucial role that volunteers played in helping to run workshops, supervision and support for children and as stewards at performances.

A University College London graduate, now a local Radio presenter, volunteered to oversee sound production and editing.

We feel that this project has had a major impact on the lives of many families and children living on the estate by encouraging residents to be proud to live here, providing opportunities to showcase local talent, motivating and inspiring young children, improving self confidence and self esteem, helping them to achieve their expressed goals and ambitions and even in surprising themselves, their friends, their families with what they were capable of.

The H Pod was used for the dance workshops on Fridays after school during term time and on Tuesday afternoons during the school holidays and the final public performances were performed at the New Diorama Theatre.

The dance pieces all have a narrative with 10 main dance routines, several individual solos and an opportunity at the end of the show for other solo performances supported by the rest of the group. The main story was on how life can be tough living in a city with the day to day stresses and people having no time to focus and concentrate on one another. The pieces were based on real life stories performed with humour and emotion.

The voice recordings of the children were produced by those not so keen on dancing or performing. There was also be a dance where movements were directed by the words spoken that will come from several short poems written by local children describing a typical day in their life.

The project ran for 6 months from May to October 2011 and brought children from different age groups together as well as those from many different backgrounds and talents. It was very much a real community project that has undoubtedly improved local children's creativity, social skills as well as enabling them to gain many other strengths.

Street dance project

I am a volunteer and have helped out with the after school homework club for about four months. Over the past month I have also helped with the Just Us project. I have seen the development of the students in the dance classes and in the homework club that runs consecutively. Over this period I noticed the dancers have shown great commitment to the project, from putting in extra hours to practicing routines before the dance class starts. Those that could not be part of the dances helped with the backdrop and posters for the show. If the dancers were not in a section of the show being rehearsed they would also help with the posters, backdrop and voice recordings for the show. The skills of the dancers have shown a lot of improvement, their ability to memorise new routines to their knowledge of musical understanding and timing. The benefits of this project have been the confidence in the children themselves. When I talked with some of the children after the actual shows they expressed how happy they were with their performances, how though they were nervous and scared but that they had a great experience and would love to do something like this again. From talking to the audience, when getting feedback, there was a massive amount of enthusiasm and positive feedback for the work done by the children and a hope that this would continue.
